RinkNet Videographer Program 2009-10 Hockey Season

Overview

RinkNet Scouting Software has produced software for NHL and CHL teams for the past 11 years. Over 1,200 hockey professionals use our software on a daily basis. Over the past three years RinkNet has expanded into supplying videos for its customers. These videos typically are 30 to 40 minutes of editing footage of one specific player. The players that videos are done on are players that could be selected in an upcoming draft (NHL or junior) or are players of interest for another reason. As part of this program we are sending our own videographers to games where these players play to record raw action footage of them so that our staff can edit and post these videos.

Job Description

Each videographer will be responsible for:

- Contacting RinkNet office to see what games and players need to be recorded.
- Arriving at game in advance to setup equipment and check for players.
- Record players game by following the player(s), not the puck (be sure that the player is always in your shot).
- Follow RinkNet specifications for camera location, zooming and shot framing.
- Submit tapes to the RinkNet office after the game (either drop off at office or mail)
- Editing of footage is not required.

Training

RinkNet will supply complete training via documentation and videos. Videographers will be expected to follow specific criteria in terms of what to tape, angles, zoom levels etc.

Compensation

Videographers will be paid on a per game basis at the rate of \$30.00 for a single game and \$20.00 per game for multiple games on the same day/location. RinkNet will also pay all out of pocket expenses (travel, admission to game and mailing costs to send videos in). Videographers are expected to supply their own equipment (camera and tri-pod), however RinkNet has a program to help people who do not have the necessary equipment in the form of an advance and payroll deduction program.

How to Apply

If a position is open you are required to send in your personal resume plus a sample of game footage that you have recorded (not player specific).
